## 2. Meeting Logistics

## 3. Project Overview

Akil Alexander provided a summary of the planned renovations:

## **Egmont:**

- Painting of hallways
- Hardware removal
- Window replacement
- Entry door replacement (front and rear)
- Work to begin around September

#### Trustman:

- Concrete patching and exterior repairs
- New lighting
- Window replacement
- Entry door replacement
- Work follows shortly after Egmont

## 4. Resident Impact and Requirements

- Access: Contractors will need access to resident units. BHA staff will accompany them at all times.
- **Notice**: Residents will receive at least 48 hours' notice, though more time will typically be provided.
- **Temporary Relocation**: During hazardous material abatement (e.g., window removal), residents will temporarily relocate to a lounge space at the rear of 15 Egmont:
  - Wi-Fi, TV, and furniture provided
  - o Bathrooms available
- **Timeline**: Each impacted resident can expect to return to their unit by the end of the day.
- **Communication**: Updates and notices will be provided regularly. Akil's contact number will be included for direct support.

### 5. Logistics & Safety Notes

- **Window Work**: The most disruptive portion will involve hazmat abatement. Residents cannot remain in units during this phase.
- **Hallway/Stairwell Storage**: All personal belongings must be removed from both front and rear stairwells.
- **Furniture Movement**: BHA staff can assist with moving items near windows. Boxes may be provided for small items.
- **Construction Duration**: Estimated to begin August 1 (pending permit), lasting approximately one year.
- **Documentation**: The meeting was recorded and will be posted on the BHA website.

# 6. Funding & Support

- Project is funded through the Town of Brookline and Massachusetts EOHLC.
- Expected to result in improved apartment comfort (e.g., reduced drafts) and enhanced building common areas.

# 7. Q&A and Resident Engagement

- No immediate questions were raised by residents during the meeting.
- Sharon Cowan and other team members reiterated that follow-up meetings and ongoing updates would be scheduled as the project progresses.
